In 1896, a 50-second-long silent film caused a panic. New to cinema, the audience sat to enjoy the moving picture marvel created by Auguste and Louis Lumière called, *L'Arrivée d'un train en gare de La Ciotat*. As the story goes, as the filmed train roared into frame, the audience panicked, and ran for the doors. And while modern scholars more or less agree that this never happened, it's not hard to imagine. Who hasn't leapt out of their seat during a horror jump scare or shed a tear during a poignant moment in a favorite movie?

The urban legend of *L'Arrivée* sticks with us because it speaks to the power of film to take us somewhere else. Cinema is and has been, an immersive art form. Even though we place a creative line between cinema and theater,

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quarters coming together, testing their limits, learning from the allied arts create new experiences that orient and entertain us in an increasingly complex and confusing world. Maybe we don't marvel at movies of trains anymore, but we are no less affected by their artistry.

From live immersive theater, remote experiences and virtual reality, the DFF continues to push the festival in an immersive direction.

This year's festival features 12 in-person projects in the VR gallery (including some of your favorites from SXSW, Tribeca, Venice International Film Festival, and Sundance), an interactive installation, and three in-person theater pieces from The Catamounts, Capital W and 600 Highwaymen.

Additionally, the fest includes audio shows from Candle House Collective and The Telelibrary, an unmissable mixed media performance called MY FIRST FILM by Zia Anger (Friday, Nov. 12th) and a special digital performance of Third Rail Projects NYC's RETURN THE MOON to close out the festival.


